

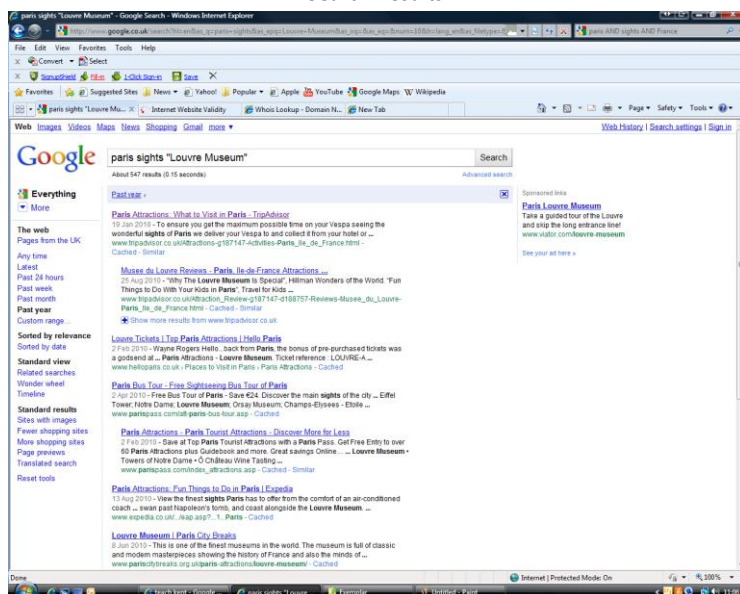


The screenshot shows the Google Advanced Search interface in a Windows Internet Explorer browser. The search criteria are as follows:

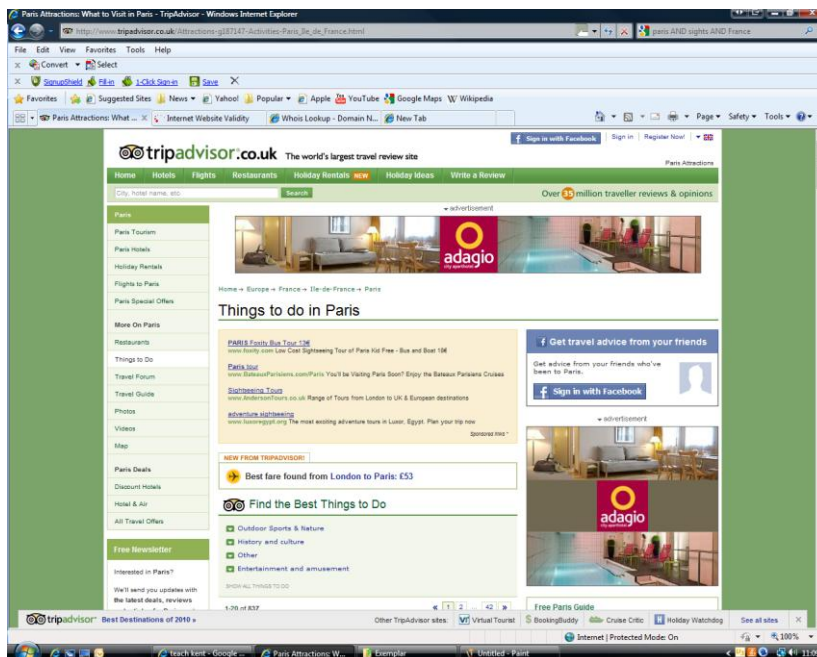

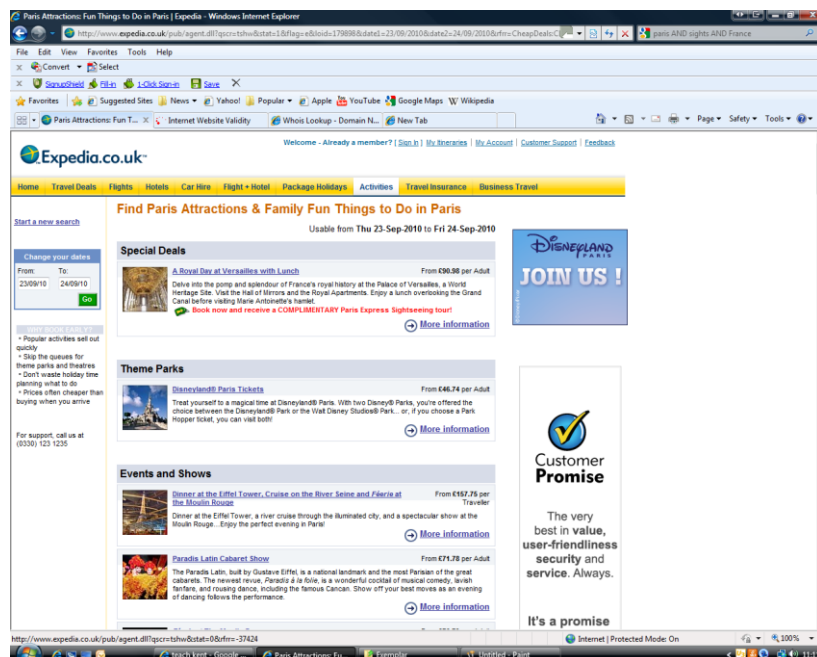

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a. Trustworthiness of websites visited(M)(D)

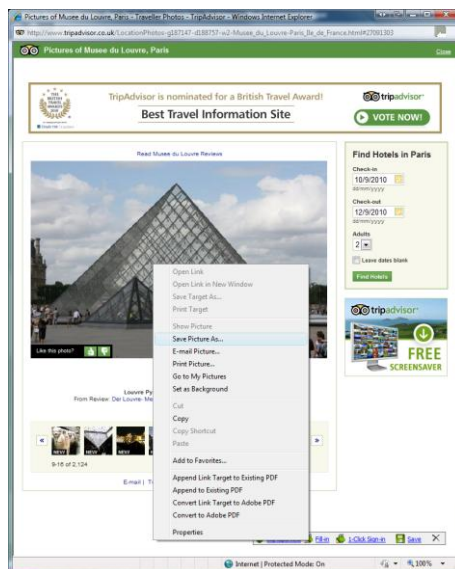

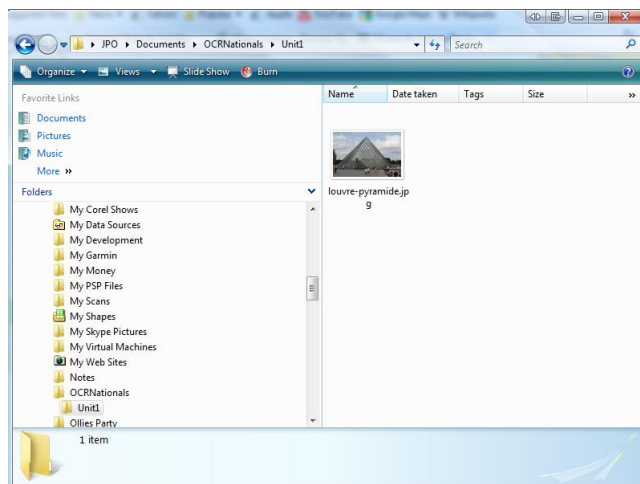

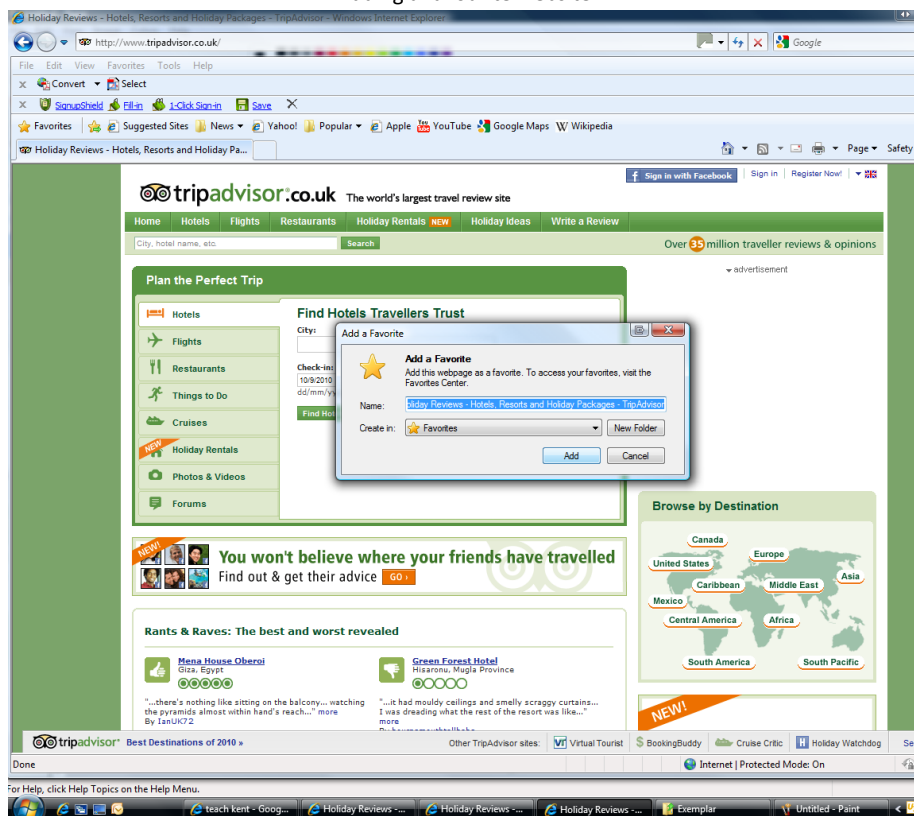

Adding a favourite website



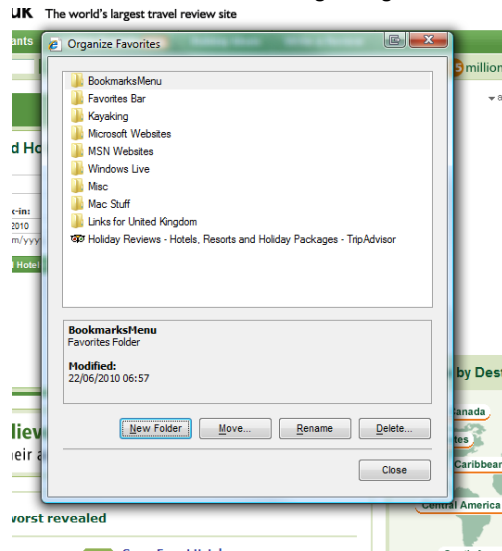
I browsed to the website I wanted to add to my favourites, clicked on Favourites -> Add Favourites.

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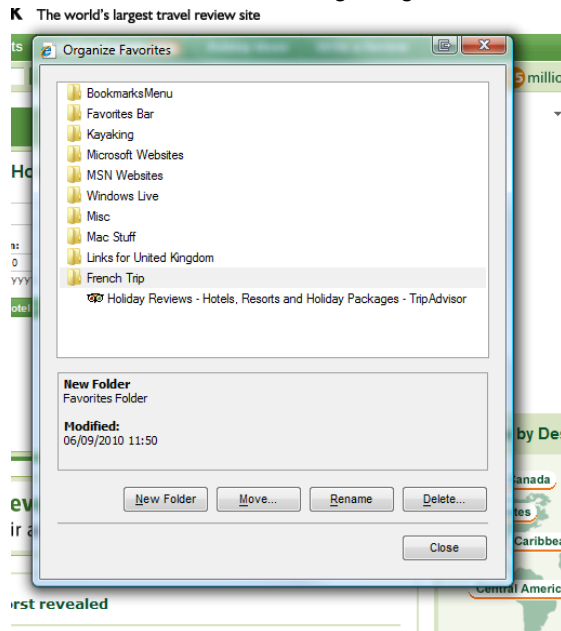
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b. Organise favourites (D)

Favourites after organising



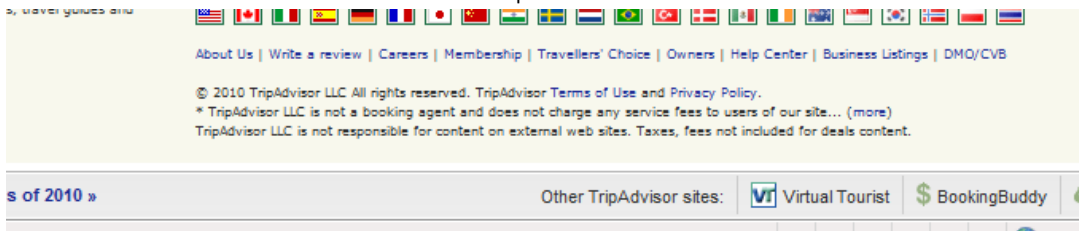
I created a new folder called French Trip and used Drag and drop to move the Trip Advisor website favourite into it. I will use this folder to store all useful websites related to the French Trip Project..

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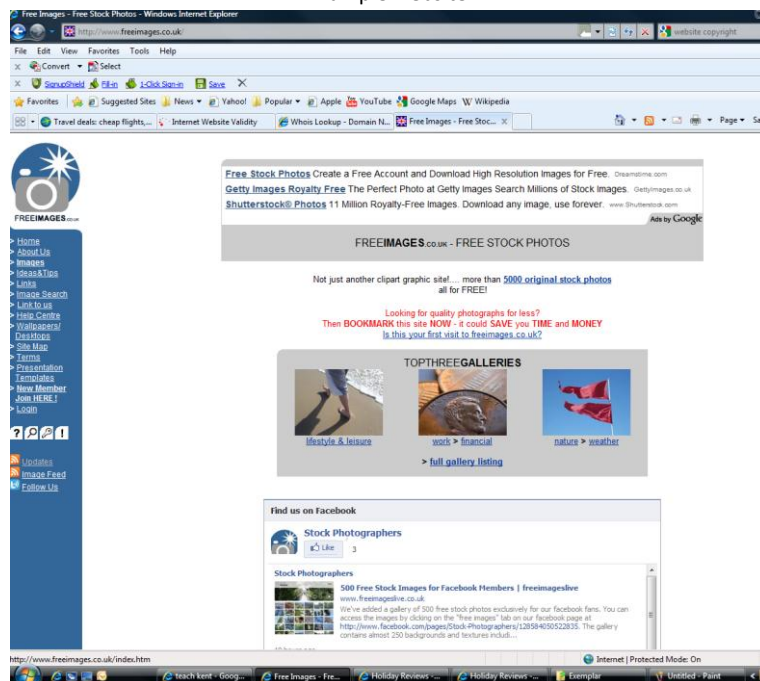
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4. Implications of copyright law (M)
